Dear Readers:

Any biotech business is dependent on an interdisciplinary, well functioning environment. Notably, they, more than businesses of other high-technology industries, need a highly developed research landscape comprising nearly all fields of natural sciences, materials sciences and engineering, and medicine. This is the case in Dresden, with the Technical University of Dresden, and in Leipzig, with the University of Leipzig, as well as many extrauniversity research institutes such as Max Planck Society and Fraunhofer Society, Leibnitz and Helmholtz research foundations, in an extraordinary way. Two interdisciplinary research institutes with six biotechnology professorships each are unique in Germany: The Biotechnology Center of the Technical University of Dresden (BIOTEC-TUD) and the Center of Biotechnology and Biomedicine of the University of Leipzig (BBZ).

In addition, Saxony accommodates two of the four DFG-funded or BMBF-funded excellence centers that joined forces in 2007 as "*Regenerative Medicine Initiative Germany*" aiming at establishing Germany as a translational location. The Center for Translational Medicine (TRM) in Leipzig and the Center for Regenerative Therapies (CRTD) in Dresden were created. The focus of the CRTD is the research into completely novel therapy approaches. They are approaching the causes of the diseases. They concentrate their research jobs onto five focuses: diabetes, neurodegeneration, cardiovascular diseases, diseases of the bones and cartilage, including oncology and immunology. The special scientific interest here is the stem cell research.

The scientific council of the CRTD affirmed in January 2009 that an internationally competitive center with top scientists could be established in a very short time and issued an extraordinary recommendation for the future of this center. These are best prerequisites for being evaluated eligible for a further funding period of four years by the German Research Foundation (DFG) in the coming May.

LIFE Competition: Innovative business ideas selected

The winners of the Leipzig Idea Competition for start-ups, LIFE, were determined: The business idea of CeSAM (Center for Studies and Assessment of Medical Systems) was elected a winner. The consulting business escorts manufacturers of medical technology in their development of intuitively, efficiently and safely usable devices. The second prize was awarded to the team of cemsteel and the third prize is shared between TransGenomix and pockit. The four winner teams received cash at 1,700 euros each, as well as coaching lessons.

The LIFE competition is directed to students and staff of the Leipzig universities. The competition was initiated by SMILE (SelbstManagementInitiativeLeipzig), a cooperation project of the University of Leipzig, the Leipzig Graduate School of Management and the Leipzig University of Applied Sciences of Technology, Business Administration and Culture.

Survey: Biotechnology industry looking to the new year in a mutedly optimistic way

The majority of the German biotech businesses assess their current situation as good (48 percent) or satisfactory (43 percent). This is the result of the survey performed by the Wirtschaftsverband der Biotechnologieindustrie, BIO Deutschland e. V. in cooperation with the "transcript" trade journal. In spite of the cautiously assessed situation, the biotech businesses, in 2009, as they did in 2008, are focusing on R&D. Approximately half of the businesses (52%) is planning expenses on this field on the previous year's level. Approximately 40% want to invest even more than in 2008.

Workforce should grow also in 2009. 50 percent of the biotech businesses interviewed plan to hire staff in 2009, compared with 71 percent in the previous year. 189 businesses participated in the survey.

New research team started working at TRM Leipzig

At the Translational Center for Regenerative Medicine (TRM) of the University of Leipzig, 23 young research teams started their scientific work in January. The researchers from differing disciplines deal with cell-therapeutical approaches, topics from materials sciences, development of new delivery systems and tissue engineering. The research projects approved will be funded in the next two years. "It was an essential criteria for the approval that there is high probability that the research ideas can be successfully taken to clinical application within the next two years", the head of the TRM Leipzig, Prof. Dr. Frank Emmrich, explains. "The objective of TRM Leipzig is the transfer from lab research to the patient", he says.

Dresden Center for Regenerative Therapies: The *smp* zebrafish gene delivers further answers to the regeneration process

Researchers at the Dresden DFG Research Center for Regenerative Therapies Dresden (CRTD) and their colleagues of Max Planck Institute for Developmental Biology in Tübingen have gone ahead a bit with the regeneration process of the zebra gene *fam53b/simplet* (*smp*): They recognized that *smp* goes active during the early new formation of the tail fin and the heart and decisively influences the structure of the newly formed tissue. In addition, the scientists proved that *smp* controls two genes that play an important role during the new formation. The researchers from Dresden and Tübingen, in further studies, will concentrate on the way the gene controls. They are also investigating in whether or not a similar gene exists in human beings.

Study at MPI-EVA Leipzig: Sleeping strengthens the immune system in animals

Species that use to sleep longer suffer less from parasites and show a higher concentration of immune cells in their blood. This was evidenced by researchers of Max Planck Institute for Evolutionary Anthropology, Leipzig, in cooperation with Durham University (UK) and Boston University School of Medicine (USA) in a current study. The results may also be important for the health of the human body. "As the duration of sleeping has decreased in the recent decades, it is important to continue the research into the immunological meaning of sleeping", warns Mr. Brian Preston, head of the international research team.

Enhancement of technology funding directive

The directive on technology funding in Saxony has been enhanced. “The opportunity is new that now investments in tangibles will be capable of being funded if these are in direct conjunction with the transfer project“, so Mr. Thomas Jurk, Secretary of Economy and Labor. This way, the purchase of machinery, plant and equipment will be funded now. An additional amendment is that consulting will be supported by up to 75 percent, instead of by up to 50 percent before. The maximum funding limit, in addition, has been raised to 500,000 euros.
